Example: I have a new bike.

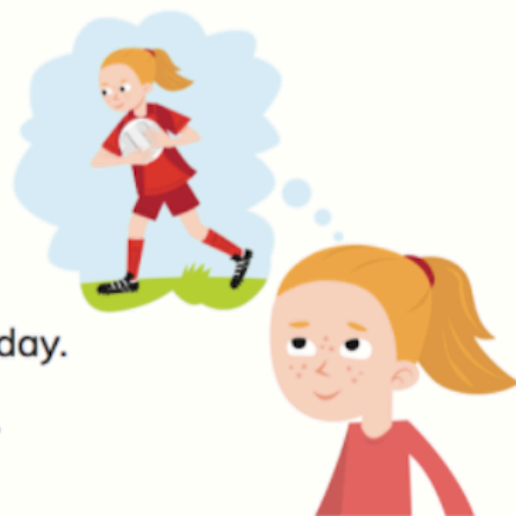
Use **'me'** when someone else is in charge.
