Dear Parents,

On behalf of the Board of Management and Staff, welcome back to a new school year. We wish you and your families all the best for 2017/2018. The Board of Management would like to bring the following routine information to your attention at the beginning of the school term:

School opens at **8.45 a.m.** Formal lessons begin promptly at 9.00 a.m.

Classes normally finish at 1.30 p.m. for the infants and 2.30 p.m. for 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> classes. <u>Pupils should be collected</u> <u>promptly at those times.</u>

The Board of Management is not responsible for children on the premises before 8.45 a.m. or after 2.30 p.m. In the interests of the children's safety, please bear this in mind. Please make sure that children do not re-enter the school after 2.30 p.m.



<u>SAFETY</u> The Board of Management is acutely aware of two dangerous aspects of our school: the bridge and stream the narrow busy and dangerous road

It is recommended that when delivering your child to school, you park safely before or beyond the railings. Please <u>do not</u> pull in at the bridge.

We have instructed the children to wait inside the gate at 2.30 p.m. Parents and/or children waiting on the bridge can cause congestion and may lead to an accident.

These recommendations are made in the interests of the safety of all the children. If you notice another parent ignoring the recommendations, you have the support of the Board of Management in mentioning the matter to the parent concerned in the first instance or to the School Principal or a member of the Board of Management.



PLEASE NOTE Please check your child's school bag on a daily basis for any notes, etc., from the school.

# SCHOOL TRACKSUITS

Wednesdays and Fridays are tracksuit days for every class.

It is very important that parents put their child's name on their uniforms and tracksuits and jackets/coats because every year a large number of tracksuits, etc., are left in the school and we cannot identify them.

# HEALTH AND SAFETY

Just a reminder that in the interests of hygiene, children are asked to bring in their own hand towel/face cloth for drying their hands.

# **BOOK BILLS**

Many thanks to the large number of families for settling their bills and making voluntary contributions to the School. If you have any monies outstanding or are unsure of your bills, please contact Statia or Linda in the office. As with all payments to the School, cheques are desirable for security reasons. Please put your cheque in an envelope and write your name, your child's name and the reason for the payment on the envelope. It would be very helpful if separate payments were made for separate bills, especially voluntary contributions. Your child may then give the envelope to the Class

Teacher or hand it in to the Office. Many new rental books have been purchased please ensure that these are kept in good condition as they are used annually.



# IRISH DANCING

Irish Dancing resumed on Thursday, 14th September 2017. The fee for Irish Dancing is €20 per term or €60 annually. All children attend this class as part of the dance element of the P.E. curriculum.

# HEALTHY EATING POLICY

Please note that in an effort to maintain our Litter Green Flag, we are asking children to bring home their uneaten lunch, wrappers and cartons. This will serve the dual purpose of cutting down on our waste and also allowing you to see exactly what your child has eaten during the day. Please consult the policy on our website regarding appropriate lunches. Your co-operation in this matter would be very much appreciated.

# NUT ALLERGIES

One of the pupils in the school has a severe allergy to nuts. In order to ensure the health and safety of all the children in the school, we would ask that you avoid including nuts in school snacks and lunches. Please Note: Peanut Butter and Nutella have a high nut content and should be avoided.

# SCHOOL UNIFORM

The school uniform is to be worn by all children. Children should wear school tracksuits on P.E. days only and the grey polo shirt should be worn with these (no soccer/football jersey or t-shirts please).

#### **COMMUNICATION**

The Board of Management and Staff, particularly the teachers, value highly communication with the parents of our pupils. It is in the best interests of the children that this communication be efficient and effective. Communication between adults can all too easily take up the educational time of the children.

The most efficient way of communicating is by writing a note in your child's journal. Separate notes should be written in instances such as explanations for illnesses, unavoidable lateness, concerns in regard to a child's work or happiness in school and other simple communications. If there is an important matter which you wish to discuss, use the journals to request an appointment with the teacher in the first instance and only then, if necessary, the School Principal.
